RESOLUTION OF ADOPTION

RESOLUTION FOR PLAN REVISION

RESOLUTION OF THE SUPERVISORS OF AMITY TOWNSHIP, BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA (hereinafter "the municipality").

WHEREAS, Section 5 of the Act of January 25, 1966, P.L. 1535, No. 537, known as the "Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act," as amended, and the Rules and Regulations of the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) adopted thereunder, Chapter 71 of Title 25 of the **Pennsylvania Code**, requires the municipality to adopt an Official Sewage Facilities Plan providing for sewage services adequate to prevent contamination of waters and/or environmental health hazards with sewage wastes, and to revise said plan whenever it is necessary to meet the sewage disposal needs of the municipality, and

WHEREAS, the engineering firm of LTL Consultants, Ltd. has prepared a "Revised Sewage Facilities Plan" which provides for sewage facilities in the Bel Air Estates mobile home park and the Valley Road area, and a sewage management plan for all of the Township not served by municipal sewer, and

WHEREAS, several alternatives were evaluated for implementation. These alternatives were:

Limekiln Interceptor - Construction of interceptor along Limekiln Road to provide public sewer to Bel Air Estates. Proposal would include sewage collection within Bel Air Estates.

Monocacy Creek Interceptor - Construction of interceptor along the creek bed of the Monocacy Creek, including sewage collection system within Bel Air Estates, and with the option of providing sewer facilities along Valley Road.

Bel Air Estates - Package Plant - Construction of a package treatment on the Bel Air Estates property, including sewage collection system, and discharging to the Monocacy Creek.

Bel Air Estates/Valley Road - Package Plant - Construction of a package treatment plant capable of serving both Bel Air Estates and properties on Valley Road, including sewage collection system, and discharging to the Monocacy Creek.

Bel Air Estates - Community On-Lot System - A community on-lot system, including sewage collection system, serving Bel Air Estates.

WHEREAS, the alternative of choice is the **Monocacy Creek Interceptor**, and

WHEREAS, the key implementation dates are:

The municipality hereby assures the Department of the complete and timely implementation of the said plan as required by law. (Section 5, Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act as amended).
